MGMT 205: Study Abroad

This study abroad is a **minimum of 21 days** and requires formal enrollment in a University study abroad program in any academic area

Upon completion of the study abroad trip, you will reflect in writing on your experience, as well as on the insights gained in a global business environment.

MGMT 206: Study Abroad Business/Leadership

This study abroad is a **minimum of 14 days** and requires formal enrollment in a University program with a focus on global business.

Upon completion of the study abroad trip, you will write a report in which you compare business/leadership in the U.S. with those of the country visited. You will also reflect on the interpersonal interactions with residents of the host country.

MGMT 481: International Internship

The study abroad requirement may be fulfilled by an international internship that meets the Breech's internship requirements found here:

Signatures from the CP&D (Bay Hall 148) and DSA (FSC 203) offices are required for approval of any International Internship application.

Upon completion of this internship, students will complete a paper reflecting on the global business experiences and insights gained from the internship.

The Breech School of Business reserves the right to rescind approval of any internship application if the safety environment in the country of destination warrants such a decision. All costs associated with the internship are the responsibility of the student.

MGMT 207: Study Abroad Service Learning

This study abroad is a **minimum of 7 days** and requires affiliation with a formal agency, organization, or University sponsorship. A student may not complete this program on an individual basis.

Upon completion of the study abroad trip, you will reflect in writing on

- The impact of a global business environment on the community visited,
- The goal of the trip and its outcomes
- Any lessons learned from the socio-cultural interactions during the experience.

Note: In many cases, student will enroll in MGMT 207 class the semester after the trip.

MGMT 208: Study Abroad International Student

International students studying business at Drury can fulfill their study abroad requirement with this course.

Students are required to write a paper reflecting upon the global business experiences and insights gained from their study in the U.S.
