May 1

"Developing New Musicians"

Dr. Jill Heyboer, professor of Music (flute) at Missouri State University, also principal flutist in the Springfield Symphony Orchestra, will speak about her teaching young people and also share her talents as a flutist.

May 8

"Scenes on Canvas"

Local artist Charles Summey will discuss his paintings and show how he develops an idea to put on canvas. His depictions of old railroad stations, churches, trains and of Stone Chapel are familiar.

The Barringer crater in Arizona is a bowl-shaped scar from a meteorite impact. The much larger Chicxulub impact in the Yucatan likely wiped out the dinosaurs some 65 million years ago. In 2003, the worlds largest meteor impact site was located some 50 miles north of Springfield bringing worldwide fame to Dr. Kevin Evans at MSU.
