

Associate of Arts in General Studies (Revised 01.2024) Offered through Drury University's Dual Credit Program Core Requirement Sheet: Minimum 62 Credit Hours

- All courses offered for the AA in General Studies can be taken ONLINE or SEATED through Drury's Dual Credit Program.
- Students work with their high school counselor, the Drury dual credit director, Beth Nation, and a Drury GO Academic Advisor assigned to the student by proximity to the student's high school.
 - The Drury Academic Advisor ensures the student is taking the needed courses and working towards completing the degree by their high school graduation date.
- The Natural Science credits may be met through Dual Credit science courses offered through the DC program or DC science courses taught at the student's high school.
