



COVID-19 Campus Visit FAQ's

Drury University

When should I arrive for my campus visit?

If possible, please arrive to Bay Hall for your campus visit no more than 10 minutes prior to your scheduled visit time.

What should I expect when I check-in for my campus visit?

When you arrive to our office of admission, located in Bay Hall, you will be greeted just inside the door at our temperature station. All visitors will be required to have their temperature taken at time of arrival and will be required to wear a mask or face covering while on campus. Any visitors and their guest(s) with a fever of 100.4 or greater will be asked to re-schedule their visit. You will then proceed to check-in at our front-desk where plexiglass stands have been installed to promote safety for our visitors and staff. All guests will be required to complete a guest information card, providing your name, email, phone number, and address. Following check-in, you will be seated in our Hearth room where there is space to distance yourself from other guests.

Will there be multiple families per tour?

To better adhere to social distancing guidelines, at this time, we will try to accommodate having one tour guide per family. Our tour guides will wear a mask and maintain six-foot separation from the family while touring our campus. There may be multiple families in the Hearth room during the introduction, seated at least six-feet apart.

How many guests will I be able to bring with me?

To lessen the chances of exposure, we have placed a limit of two additional guests per student.

How will you facilitate social distancing during a tour?

While on tour, your guide will be wearing a mask and will maintain a six-foot distance. Hand sanitizer will be available for use at all times. All surfaces and doors along the tour route will be sanitized on a daily basis.

How will you facilitate social distancing in a Q&A session?

All Q&A sessions will be conducted by an admission counselor with an individual family or with multiple families seated at least six-feet apart. The counselor and guests will be required to wear a mask at all times. After each session, the area will be sanitized.

What about handshakes?

Per social distancing guidelines, we discourage personal contact. Don't worry, we won't interpret the lack of a handshake as rude! We look forward to having you back on campus in the future where we can have these types of interactions.

Should I bring a mask?

To ensure the health and safety of our visitors and employees, we will require that all guests and staff wear a mask while on campus. We ask that you provide your own mask. If you are not able to do so or forget to bring one, no worries, additional masks will be available. If you are not able to wear a mask for health reasons, you will be asked to provide documentation.

Will there be refreshments available?

Bottled water will be available to keep you hydrated during your visit!

I have COVID-19 symptoms and/or have been exposed to the virus in the past 14 days. What should I do?

We encourage you to take time prior to your visit to consider the state of your health and respond appropriately. We are dedicated to the health of our visitors and staff and ask that you refrain from visiting if you are sick or have been exposed to someone who is sick. We will work with you to reschedule once you are healthy again.

I don't have a scheduled appointment. Can I drop in for a campus tour?

At this time, we are not accepting walk-in visits. We are happy to work with you to schedule a visit through our website so that we can best ensure all accommodations are set for a safe and enjoyable campus visit experience.
