

## History Major: Graduation Plan

### Four-year Plan:

This is a suggestive plan for students who major in History. First-year students should take the Methods course as soon as possible. The Methods course, which emphasizes writing and research, is only offered in the spring semester. Students should work to fulfill the required categories depending on which classes have been previously fulfilled. They should take HPRL493: Capstone Research Seminar, in the fall of their senior year (it is only offer in the fall semester). Before taking HPRL493, students should complete the Methods course and at least three 300L courses.

A four-year course template is illustrated below:

Depending on the number of credit transferred, each student is required to take slightly different courses to fulfill the Major requirements. Therefore, it is essential that each student meets with the department chair or advisor to discuss the course plan.
