



Associate of Arts in General Studies
Offered through Drury University's Dual Credit Program
Degree Requirement: Minimum 62 Credit Hours

- All courses for the AA in General Studies can be taken ONLINE or SEATED via Drury's Dual Credit Program.
- Students work with their high school counselor and the Drury Dual Credit Director, Beth Nation, in completing the degree requirements.
- During the spring semester of the student's senior year, Beth Nation will complete a degree audit to ensure degree requirements have been met.
- Textbooks/materials are provided at no charge to the student for each course and are linked in the course syllabus, **EXCEPT for all MATH courses.**
 - Online textbooks for MATH courses must be purchased through Pearson MyMathLab. Cost is approximately \$80-\$100.
- If a student began taking DC courses prior to Fall 2025 and took both GSTU 110 and GSTU 210, both GSTU courses (together) will count for GSTU 212. If a student took GSTU 110 or GSTU 210 prior to Fall 2025, but did not take both courses, the one GSTU (110 or 210) course the student took will count as an elective.
